SPENCERVILLE RIVERSIDE PARK: A Place to Remember, Relax, and Enjoy



In deciding on a memorial for dad – Les Hutton – the Spencerville Riverside Park was the ideal location. Dad grew up in Spencerville and spent time at the river as both a child and adult. The Nation River was the spot to go swimming, fishing, catching bullfrogs and tadpoles and to enjoy the annual barrel races.

In the early 1950's Dad founded the barrel races as a fundraiser for the Spencerville fire department of which he was a life long member. After more then 6 decades you can still come out in the spring to capture the barrels going over the falls and racing to the finish!

The addition of the Riverside Park last year presented us with the opportunity to sponsor a bench in dad's memory. We felt this was a very fitting location.

Today the Riverside Park is enjoyed by many that stop by for a picnic, fishing or just to enjoy the relaxing view.
